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**SHORT ROW TECHNIQUES**

The short row is done by knitting only part of a row, then turning to work back on the other side. Each method gives a different finish. Try them all, and use the technique suitable for your project.

C.O. 20 sts for samples.

- 1) K<sub>15</sub>, T, P<sub>15</sub>--Leaves Hole.
- 2) K<sub>10</sub>, T, sl 1st, P<sub>9</sub>--Tight Tension.
- 3) K<sub>5</sub>, sl 1st pw, byF, sl st b, byb, T (looks like P st), (Hide wrap-K<sub>5</sub>, K<sub>1</sub> (by knitting wrap and st on needle tog) - like K<sub>2</sub> tog. I like this technique for even tension.
- 4) K<sub>5</sub>, byf, sl 1st pw, byb, T.
- 5) Hide Wraps
  - a) Knit Stitch--Insert needle under wrap from bottom up and knit st on needle--like K<sub>2</sub> tog.
  - b) Purl Stitch--Insert R needle to the back under the wrap from bottom up and put on L needle--P<sub>2</sub> tog.
  - c) Garner Stitch--No need for special technique.
